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
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


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Bees and grasshoppers would buzz by me on their way to work in the cornfields. Cows and horses would clomp across my back going to and from the barn.

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I would enjoy the sounds of the tractors humming, threshers swishing, cows mooing, and horses neighing. Busy, busy, busy sounds.

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
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Every day the street cleaner would scrub and spray me, followed by city workers who would help keep me clean as a whistle. I like to be clean.

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
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
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
Complete a Road Scene

- Step 2. Create a unique title for your picture.




Four Places, Four Ways, Four Times
